Dear Tipton Parishioners,

Our beloved church has been a beacon of faith and beauty for the last 55 years. However, time and weather have taken their toll. The 14 church windows are in need of replacement.

Why Replace the Windows?

- A Legacy of Faith: Completing this project shows our commitment to this sacred space and leaves a lasting legacy for future parishioners.
- Improved Energy Efficiency: Our current windows are single pane. The double -pane windows that will be installed consist of two panes of glass separated by an insulating layer of air/gas. This creates a significant barrier to heat transfer, keeping the church cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter. This will help to reduce our energy bills.
- Reduced Condensation: Our current windows have condensation problems during the winter. This is because the warm, moist air inside the church comes into contact with the cold glass, causing moisture to form on the window surface. The double-pane windows will minimize condensation on the interior surface which will reduce the risk of mold growth and damage to window frames and walls. This can help protect the interior of the church from moisture-related problems.

I pray that over these next couple of weeks that you prayerfully consider how you will help to support this project. The fundraising portion of the campaign will begin in May as we honor Mary, the Mother of God.

PARISH NURSING NOTES

APRIL IS ALCOHOL AWARENESS MONTH - Alcohol Use: Conversation Starters It takes courage to talk to a family member or friend about their alcohol use. These tips can help you start the conversation.

Be prepared. Get ready for the conversation:

- Before you talk, take some time to accept your own feelings. It's normal to feel nervous or upset.
- Practice what you'll say. Try writing a script or roleplaying the conversation with a friend ahead of time.
- Plan to keep it brief. Try focusing on just 1 change that could help your loved one. Find a good time and place to talk. Wait until you're both feeling calm and you can focus on the conversation without distractions

Keep it positive. Try to:

- Use positive language and avoid judging. Instead of "I wish you wouldn't drink every night," try "How about trying a few alcohol-free nights each week?"
- Focus on the benefits of making a change. For example, you can say: "It would be great to spend more time together as a family."
- Emphasize that quitting drinking or drinking less is possible. You can say: "Lots of people have struggled with alcohol. You're not alone, and it can get better."

Get specific. For example, you can:

- Give specific reasons for your concerns based on what you see and feel. You can say, "I'm worried about your drinking because I've noticed you've been missing work."
- Make specific suggestions. Try saying: "Let's do things that don't involve drinking. How about seeing a movie?"

Offer support. Try to:

- Show that you understand. Say: "I know that drinking less is hard for you. How can I support you?"
- Be available for your loved one. You can say: "Talk to me when you want a drink. Whenever you feel the urge to drink, you can call or text me instead."
- Take a break and give your loved one space if the conversation isn't productive. You can say: "I can see that you're not ready to talk about this yet. I'm here for you whenever you **are** ready."

Make a plan together. You and your loved one can:

- Work together to make a list of goals. Choose 1 goal as a first step like taking 2 nights off from drinking each week. Make sure it's something you can measure easily.
- Set a date to talk again and see how it's going. Offer encouragement if it's going well, and set different goals if it's not working.

Get help. You can:

Encourage your loved one to visit the doctor. Offer to make the appointment and go along for support if your loved one is ready to get treatment. <u>Use this tool to explore alcohol treatment</u> options together https://alcoholtreatment.niaaa.nih.gov/
